Queiroz and the second or paternal family name is Scherer.

In this Portuguese name , the first or maternal family 1 name isand the second or paternal family name is

Fernando de Queiroz Scherer (born October 6, 1974) is a Brazilian former 1 international swimmer.

He won the bronze medal in the 50-meter freestyle at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta and another bronze 1 medal four years later in Sydney with the Brazilian relay team in the 4×100-meter freestyle.[1]

Scherer won his first major title 1 at the inaugural 1993 FINA Short Course World Championships in Palma de Mallorca, where he won the 100-meter freestyle.

He trained 1 at The Race Club, a swimming club founded by Olympic swimmers Gary Hall, Jr. and his father, Gary Hall, Sr.

as a 1 training group for elite swimmers in preparation for the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games.[2]

Scherer is nicknamed Xuxa in his native country, 1 and he became Brazil's Sportsman of The Year in 1995 after winning one gold and one silver medal at the 1 1995 FINA Short Course World Championships in Rio de Janeiro.

Scherer was involved in the organization Cansei.

In 2009, he took part 1 in the second season of a reality television program called A Fazenda, where one of his fellow contestants was his 1 future wife, the actress and dancer Sheila Mello.

Scherer and Mello married on June 24, 2010, in São Paulo.

[3][4]Beginning [edit 1]

Scherer began swimming when he was a child to help improve his respiratory problems.

When he was 14, he participated in his first competitions and trained at the Doze de Agosto club.

In 1992, he began to achieve national prominence, winning the 1 50-meter freestyle and 100-meter freestyle in the Brazil Trophy.

That day, his friends created a nickname "Xuxa", by which Scherer became widely known because his blond hair resembled that of a children's television presenter with the same name.[5]

International career [edit 1]1993 [edit]

At the Brazilian short course championship, the Jose Finkel Trophy in Santos on July 7, 1993, the 1 Brazilian team comprising Fernando Scherer, Teófilo Ferreira, José Carlos Souza and Gustavo Borges, broke the world record in the 4x100-meter freestyle with a time of 3:13.

97-three centiseconds better than the Swedish team record of 3:14.

00 from March 19, 1989.

On December 15, Brazil again broke the world record, with the same team, with a time of 3:12.11.

[6] This mark was achieved at the 1993 FINA World Swimming Championships (25 m), in Palma de Mallorca, where Scherer won his first major titles: the gold in the 100-meter freestyle and in the 4x100-meter freestyle, at 19 years of age and after five years of competitive swimming experience.

With this, Scherer was elected as the revelation athlete of Brazil.

[5] He also finished eighth in the 1 50-meter freestyle.

1994 [edit]

Scherer participated in the 1994 World Aquatics Championships in Rome, where he won the bronze in the 4x100-meter freestyle-along with Teófilo Ferreira, André Teixeira and Gustavo Borges.

[6][7] Scherer also finished 10th in the 50-meter freestyle and 14th in the 100-meter freestyle.[8]1995 [edit]

In 1995, Scherer signed with Flamengo.

He was the first swimmer with signed contract.

[5] In March, he competed at the 1995 Pan American Games in Argentina, where he became champion of the 50-meter freestyle, two silver medals in 4x100-meter freestyle and 4x200-meter freestyle, and bronze in the 100-meter freestyle.

[9] He was named the Brazilian Athlete of the Year in 1995, after winning two gold medals in the 100-meter freestyle and 4x100-meter freestyle at the 1995 FINA World Swimming Championships (25 m) in Rio de Janeiro.

[10] In the 4x100-meter freestyle, he opened with a time of 47.

74 seconds in the heats and a time of 47.

63 seconds in the final-a South American and Championship record.

He also won a silver medal in the 50-meter freestyle.

1996 [edit]

At the 1996 Summer Olympics, in Atlanta, Scherer earned a bronze medal in the 50-metre freestyle, came 5th in the 100-metre freestyle and 4th in the 4x100-metre freestyle.[11]1997 [1 edit]

1997 was a bad year for Scherer.

He could not swim competitively for six months after experiencing problems in his left shoulder and both knees caused after the Olympics.

[5] He competed in the 1997 FINA World Swimming Championships (25 m), where he finished 13th in the 100-meter freestyle, and 20th in the 50-meter freestyle.

1998 [edit]

In 1998, Scherer moved to Coral Springs, Florida.

[5] He swam at the 1998 World Aquatics Championships, in Perth, Australia, where he finished eighth in the 50-meter freestyle, 17th in the 100-meter freestyle and sixth in the 4x100-meter freestyle.

[12] In August in New York City, 1 at the Goodwill Games, Scherer broke the South American record for the 50-meter freestyle with a time of 22.

18 seconds, 1 that would only be broken in 2007 by César Cielo.

He also broke the 100-metre freestyle record with a time of 1 48.

69 seconds, which was unbroken until 2006, also by Cielo.

[13][14] With that, Scherer attained first place in the world rankings 1 in both events; he was awarded the title of "World's Best" by Swimworld magazine, and for the second time the 1 best Brazilian athlete, by COB.

[5] At this time, the world record for the 50-meter freestyle was 21.

81 seconds, set by 1 Tom Jager; the 100-meter freestyle world record was 48.

21 seconds, set by Alexander Popov.

At the end of 1998, Scherer broke 1 the third consecutive world record by a Brazilian relay team in the 4x100-meter freestyle on short course.

On December 20, shortly 1 after the end of Jose Finkel Trophy, the team of Scherer, Carlos Jayme, Alexandre Massura and Gustavo Borges, in order, 1 fell the pool at Club de Regatas Vasco da Gama and recorded a time of 3:10.

45; a record which would 1 be broken in 2000 by the Swedish team.[6][15]

In this competition, Scherer had also broken the short-course South American records in 1 the 50-meter freestyle with a time of 21.

44 seconds, the 100-meter freestyle with a time of 47.

17 seconds, and the 1 Brazilian record in the 100-meter butterfly with a time of 53.13 seconds.

[16] In the 50-meter freestyle, Scherer was 0.

13 seconds 1 slower than Mark Foster's world record of 21.

31 seconds, obtained on December 13.

He also came close to the world record 1 in the 100-meter freestyle of 46.

74 seconds set by Popov in 1994.

Scherer was also elected Best Swimmer in the World, 1 in 1998, by FINA.

1999 [edit]

In March 1999, Scherer broke the South American record for the 50-meter butterfly twice 1 in one week.

[5] Also this year, Scherer participated in the 1999 Pan American Games in Winnipeg, in which Brazil achieved 1 its best swimming results of all time.

The Brazilian 4x100-meter medley relay team of Alexandre Massura, Marcelo Tomazini, Gustavo Borges and 1 Scherer won the race for the first time in the Pan's history, with a time of 3:40.

27, breaking the Pan 1 American and South American records and securing a place in the 2000 Summer Olympics.

Scherer also won the gold in the 1 50-meter freestyle, 100-meter freestyle, and 4x100-meter freestyle and broke the South American record for the latter race, becoming the first 1 Brazilian to win four gold medals in the same Pan American Games.

[5][17]2000 [edit]

This year, Scherer forwent all competitions 1 to prepare for the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney. However, after an accident on the stairs of his house he sprained 1 an ankle and partially tore the ligament, almost costing him the Games.

Although his injury affected his performance-he hardly used his 1 legs-, Scherer won the bronze in the 4x100-meter freestyle and participated in two other heats, ranking 12th in the 4x100-meter 1 medley and 20th in the 50-meter freestyle.

[5][11]2002 [edit]

In 2002, Scherer returned to Brazil and moved to São Paulo.[5]2003 1 [edit]

Scherer and Gustavo Borges in the 2003 Pan American Games

At the 2003 World Aquatics Championships in Barcelona, Scherer 1 broke his own South American record in the 50-meters butterfly with a time of 23.86 seconds.

[18] He went to the 1 final, finishing in 8th.

[19] He also finished 23rd in the 50-meter freestyle,[20] and 12th in the 4x100-meter freestyle.[21]

At the age 1 of 29, Scherer competed in the his third Pan American Games in Santo Domingo, where he helped Brazil win 21 1 medals in swimming-Brazil's all-time record.

Scherer won the gold in the 50-meter freestyle, beating the Olympic champion Gary Hall Jr. and world 1 champion José Meolans, and gold in the 4x100-meter freestyle.[22]2004 [edit] In May, Scherer equaled his South American record of 1 23.

86 seconds in the 50-meter butterfly.

[23] At the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, he swam just one race, ranking 11th 1 in the 50-meter freestyle.[11]2005 [edit]

Now 30 years old, Scherer competed in the 2005 World Aquatics Championships in Montreal, 1 where on June 24, he broke the South American record in the 50-meter butterfly in the semifinals with a time 1 of 23.

55 seconds,[24] a record that was beaten in 2009 by César Cielo.

[25][26] Scherer finished fifth in the final.

[27] He 1 also finished in 24th place in the 50-meter freestyle.[28]2007 [edit]

In 2007, Scherer retired from competitive swimming.[5]Records [edit 1]

3. oq é brazino jogo da galera :aposta de jogo do bicho online

Primeiro-ministro irlandês expressa raiva e insatisfeição com o custo "inaceitável" de um abrigo para bicicletas no local do parlamento irlandês

O 9 primeiro-ministro irlandês, Simon Harris, disse que está "raivoso e insatisfeito" com o custo "inaceitável" de €336.000 por um abrigo para 9 bicicletas oq é brazino jogo da galera Leinster House, oq é brazino jogo da galera Dublin, a sede do parlamento irlandês.

O taoiseach disse a uma conferência de imprensa que as 9 pessoas podiam ver os benefícios de ter um local para estacionar uma bicicleta oq é brazino jogo da galera um local de trabalho, mas o 9 que elas não percebiam era "a extraordinária quantia de dinheiro" que o abrigo custou, e nem ele.

Seus comentários coincidiram com 9 os do ministro dos Transportes e ex-líder do Partido Verde, Eamon Ryan - ele mesmo um ciclista - que disse 9 que o projeto parecia ser "incrivelmente caro".

A estrutura, que pode acomodar 36 bicicletas, consiste oq é brazino jogo da galera um toldo de aço projetado 9 para ser duradouro e proteger as bicicletas dos elementos.

Kieran O'Donnell, o ministro com responsabilidade pelo Escritório de Obras Públicas (OPW), 9 que realizou o trabalho, solicitou uma revisão imediata do projeto.

Um porta-voz do OPW disse que o abrigo para bicicletas "foi 9 obtido por meio de um acordo marco e cumpre com as diretrizes de aquisição pública e planejamento", mas citou a 9 natureza histórica e o local de Leinster House como um fator de custo majoritário.

Ele disse que "reconhece a importância de 9 garantir que o dinheiro público seja gasto transparentemente", mas que a construção apresentou "desafios únicos" porque Leinster House é uma 9 "estrutura protegida de importância nacional".

Quase €284.000 foram gastos na construção do abrigo e quase €3.000 oq é brazino jogo da galera serviços arqueológicos. O IVA 9 representou mais de €38.000 e os custos administrativos, incluindo medição, chegaram a quase €11.000.

"Os materiais utilizados, incluindo granito irlandês, vidro 9 e aço, foram cuidadosamente selecionados não apenas por oq é brazino jogo da galera durabilidade, mas também por oq é brazino jogo da galera compatibilidade com o setting histórico de 9 nossa parliament nacional", disse o OPW.

As obras no abrigo começaram oq é brazino jogo da galera janeiro e foram concluídas oq é brazino jogo da galera meados de abril.
